

ELISHA STEVENS, OF CROMWELL, CONNECTICUT

DESIGN FOR A TOY MONEY-BOX.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,509, dated March 5,1878; application filed February 20, 1878. [Term of patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ELISHA STEVENS, of Cromwell, in the county of Middlesex and State of Connecticut, have originated and designed a new and ornamental Design for Toy Banks, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making a part of this specification, and showing, in perspective, a toy bank in accordance with the design.

The main portion or body of the bank is made to represent a cottage having a gable roof. Said body may be ornamented with windows of Gothic or other shape. At or near one end of the ridge b of the roof of such cottage-like figure is an ornamental chimney, d. Projecting also from the ridge of the roof, and

along it, is an ornamental ridge-strip, f, designed to form an ornamental pedestal on which a bird, g, having its head directed toward and over the chimney d, is mounted.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for toy banks consisting of a cottage ornamented by a projection representing a chimney on the ridge of the roof, and by a ridge-strip forming a pedestal, which is ornamented by a bird, the head of which is directed toward and over the chimney, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
