

DESIGN FOR A TOY MONEY-BOX.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 11,967, dated September 21, 1880.

Application filed June 7, 1880. Term of patent 34 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES H. BOWEN, a citizen of the United States, residing in the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and produced a new and useful Design for a Toy Money-Box, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

The figure is a front view of my newly-invented toy money-box.

Referring to the drawing, A represents the

box, which is in the form of an owl represented as standing on a base, B, of the form of a log of wood, producing an attractive design.

I claim-

The design for a toy money-box of the form of an owl standing on a base of the form of a log, as described.
