

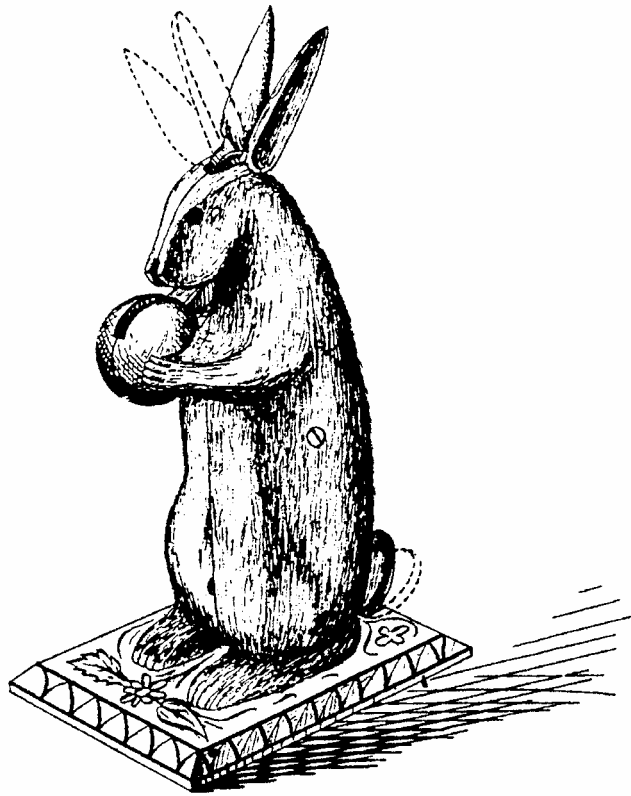

## DESIGN FOR A TOY BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 13,261, dated August 22, 1882.

Application filed June 23, 1882. Term of patent 7 years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HENRY S. LOCKWOOD,  
of South Norwalk, in the county of Fairfield  
and State of Connecticut, have invented a new  
5 and Improved Design for Toy Banks, of which  
the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

Reference is to be had to the accompanying  
drawing, in which a perspective view of my  
10 newly-designed toy bank is shown.

The design consists in a rabbit standing or  
resting on its hind legs and eating an apple or  
other fruit, which it holds between the front  
legs or paws. The fruit is provided with a  
15 slot, through which coins can be dropped into  
the hollow rabbit, which thus serves as a toy  
bank. The ears of the rabbit are pivoted so

that they can be swung forward, as shown in  
dotted lines, and the rabbit's tail is also pivoted  
and can be swung. The rabbit's ears, the fruit 20  
the rabbit is holding, and the base on which  
the rabbit rests can be made more or less or-  
namental, as may be desired.

Having thus described my invention, I claim  
as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent— 25

The herein-described design for toy savings-  
banks, consisting of a rabbit standing on its  
hind legs and holding a fruit between its front  
legs or paws, as set forth.
