

DESIGN FOR A TOY BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 13,401, dated November 7, 1882.

Application filed October 7, 1882. Term of patent 31 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that J, CHARLES F. RITCHEL, a citizen of the United States, residing at Bridgeport, in the county of Fairfield and State of Connecticut, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Toy Banks, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

The drawing is a side elevation of my newly-

designed toy bank.

The general feature of the design consists of the figure of a boot-black sitting on his box, in front of a street-hydrant, with outstretched 15 hands holding a brush, between which and the top of the hydrant the coins are to be placed by the depositors for discharge into the bank, when another boy, standing behind the first, swings down a huge hat upon the head of the 20 latter, the said figures being mounted on the

top of the case or box of the bank.

The features of my design consist of the seated figure of the boy with outstretched arms a, holding a brush, b, in front of the figure of 25 a street-hydrant, c, the seat d of the boy being in representation of the boot-black's box, with foot-rest eattached thereto. The left arm appears slightly raised above the right one, and the right foot slightly advanced beyond 30 the left. The standing figure holding the hat over the sitting one is represented as standing on the right leg, f, with the left one, g, bent forward at the knee, the arms being horizontal or thereabout to the elbows, and thence slightly 35 raised to the hat, and the left one showing slightly over the right one. The hat has a line, h, near the top of the crown, which, together with the line i of the upper edge of the band, represents a wide band of cloth or other web 40 stretched round the crown. The box or case of the bank has bevel or angle corners j, the

sides of which are paneled by the raised border k and ornamented with the diamond figures l, inclosed by the raised cross-bars m, having coils n and points o. The side panel, p, is figured with the words "Shoot That Hat Bank," arranged in three oblique lines, together with the raised figures q, s, and t.

I claim-

1. The design for a toy bank herein shown 50 and described, the same consisting of the seated figure of the boy with outstretched arms holding a brush, b, in front of the figure of a street hydrant, c, the seat d of the boy being in representation of the boot-black's box with 55 foot-rest e attached thereto, the left arm of the figure of the boy being slightly raised above the right one and the right foot advanced beyond the left one.

The design for a toy bank herein shown 60 described, the same consisting of the standing figure of the boy holding the hat over the sitting one, and represented as standing on the right leg, with the left one bent forward at the knee, the arms being horizontal or thereabout 65 to the elbows, and thence slightly rising to the hat and the left one slightly showing over the right one, together with the figure of the hat represented with a band around it.

3. The design for a toy bank herein shown 70 and described, the same consisting of the angle or bevel corners j with paneled sides, having the raised diamond figures l and cross-bars m, said cross-bars having coils n and points o.

4. The design for a toy bank herein shown 75 and described, the same consisting of the paneled sides p of the case, having the words and letters and the figures q s t.
