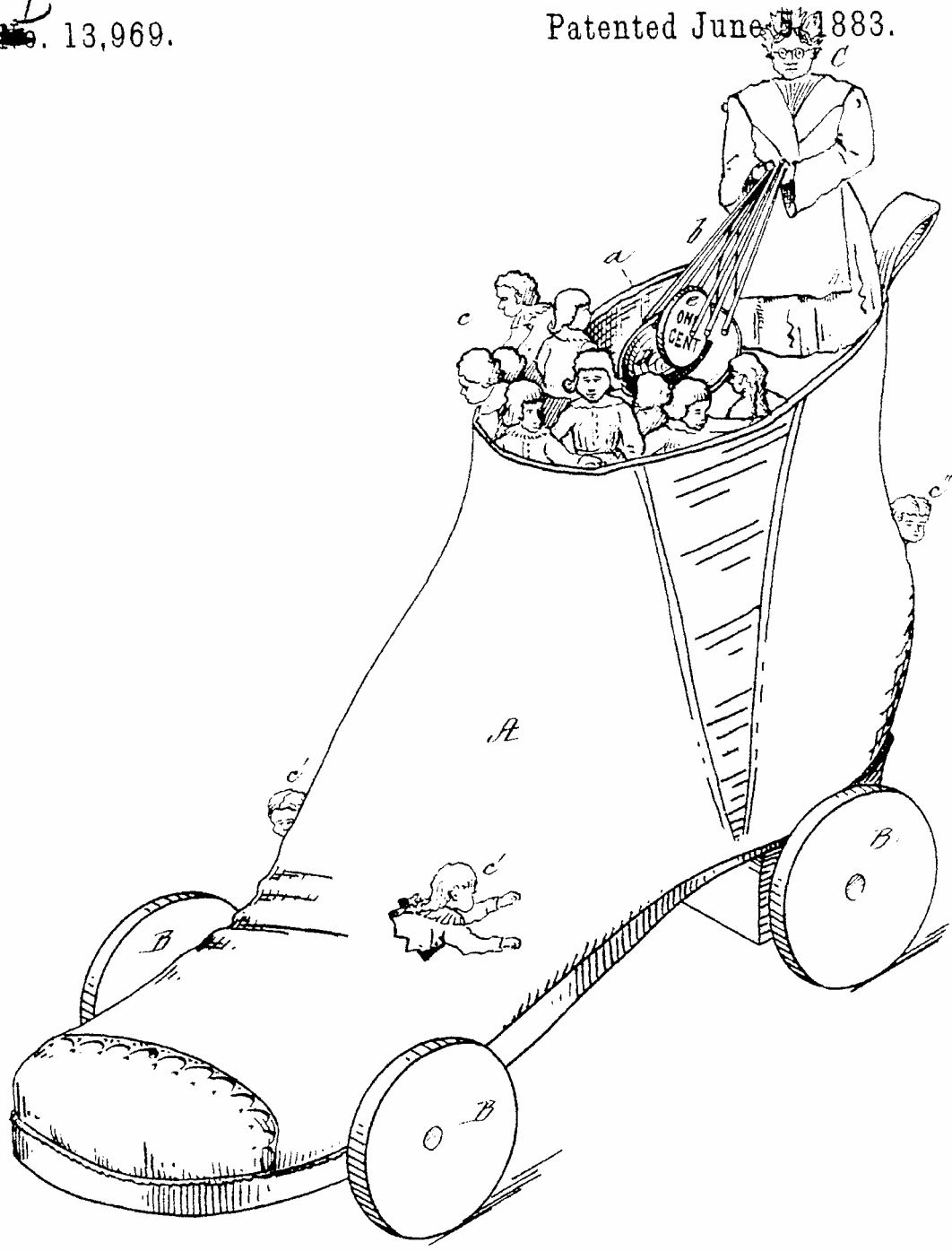

## DESIGN FOR A TOY MONEY-BOX.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 13,969, dated June 5, 1883.

Application filed April 21, 1883. Term of patent 3½ years.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, WILLIAM S. REED, of Leominster, in the county of Worcester and State of Massachusetts, have invented and produced a Design for Toy Money-Boxes, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

My present design is for the external configuration of a toy money-box, which has for its leading feature the representation of a shoe, with the old woman and her children in connection therewith to illustrate the nursery character of the same.

In the said drawing, which is a perspective view of my design, A represents a shoe mounted on wheels B. In the opening *a* for the foot is the figure C of the old woman in a standing

position, with a bundle of sticks, *b*, in her hands and a group of figures of children, *c*, before her, while through the "upper" of the shoe and its "quarter" project the heads of the figures of other children, *c' c''*. At the center of the opening *a* is located the passage *d*, through which the coin *e* is deposited into the receptacle.

I claim—

A design for a money box, consisting of the figure of a shoe, A, with the old woman C and children *c' c''*, represented in connection therewith, as herein shown and described.
