

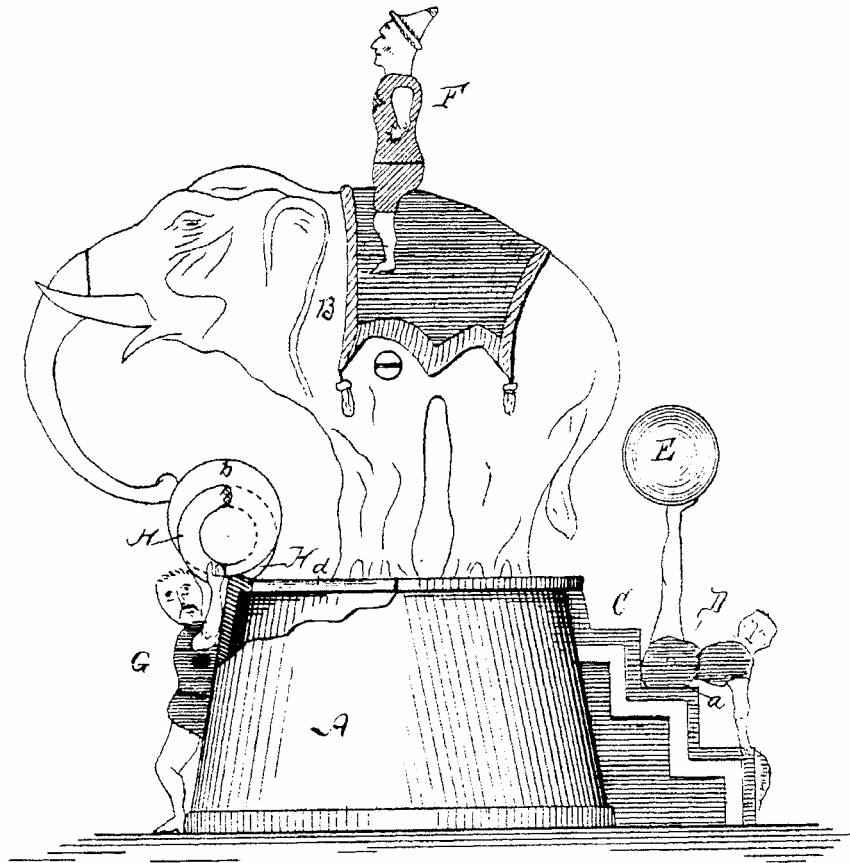

DESIGN FOR A TOY SAVINGS-BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 14,238, dated August 28, 1883.

Application filed June 7, 1883. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES H. BOWEN, of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have invented and
5 produced a new and original Design for Toy Savings-Banks, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

This new and improved design for a toy savings-bank is illustrated in the accompanying drawing, the figure representing a view of
10 the same in elevation.

In the drawing, A represents a base of the form of a truncated cone, on the upper surface of which, in a standing position, is an image of an elephant, B, in side view. At the
15 right side of the base are steps C, leading from the ground or floor, &c., on which the base rests. To the top of the base, and on one, a, of these steps, is the figure of an acrobat, D,
20 inverted, resting on his back on said step, and otherwise supporting himself by his hands on the next lower step, his face turned to the front, and his legs, which extend upward, supporting on his feet a ball or globe, E. Sitting
25 astride of the elephant's back is a clown or acrobat. At the side of the base opposite to the steps C, and under the head and trunk of the elephant, is another acrobat, G, standing on the floor or ground, with his back to the
30 side of the base, and holding in each hand, above his head, a hoop or "banner," H,

which hoops or banners project onto and partially rest on the top of base A.

I claim—

1. The improved design for a toy savings- 35 bank, consisting of a base, A, supporting an elephant having on its back a clown or acrobat, substantially as shown.

2. The improved design for a toy savings- 40 bank, consisting of a base, A, supporting an elephant having on its back a clown or acrobat, and steps at one side of the base, on which steps rests an acrobat in an inverted position, supporting on his feet a ball or globe, sub- 45 stantially as shown.

3. The improved design for a toy savings- 45 bank, consisting of a base, A, supporting an elephant having on its back a clown or acrobat, and steps at one side of the base, on which steps rests an acrobat in an inverted position, 50 supporting on his feet a ball or globe, and at the other side of its base an acrobat holding hoops or banners in his hands above his head, substantially as shown.
