DESIGN FOR A TOY SAVINGS-BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 15,085, dated June 17, 1884.

Application filed January 29, 1884. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, CHARLES G. SHEP-ARD and PETER ADAMS, Jr., citizens of the United States, residing at Buffalo, in the 5 county of Erie and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Toy Savings-Bank, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming 10 part thereof.

This design relates to the general configuration or form of a toy savings-bank; and it consists of a figure representing the head of a clown.

Our novel design is clearly represented in the accompanying drawing, in which A represents the head of the clown, B the cap, C one of the arms, and D the upper portion of the body. The forehead and cheeks are painted of the provided with marks, as shown, in the

manner usually adopted by clowns. The clothing, represented as being applied to the upper part of the body, is ornamented with stars E, and the neck is surrounded by a collar. F.

We do not in this application claim a design 25 of the configuration shown and claimed in Letters Patent No. 12,814, granted to us March 14, 1882.

We claim-

The design for a toy savings-bank, consist-30 ing of a figure representing the head of a clown, substantially as herein shown and described.
