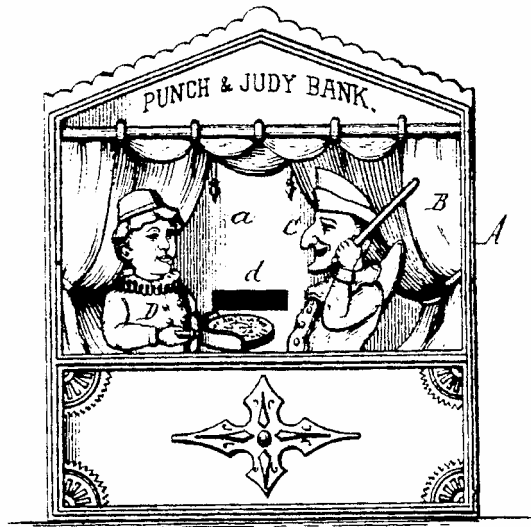

DESIGN FOR A TOY SAVINGS-BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 15,155, dated July 22, 1884.

Application filed May 28, 1884. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, CHARLES G. SHEPARD and PETER ADAMS, Jr., citizens of the United States, residing at Buffalo, in the county of Erie and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Toy Savings-Bank, of which the following is a specification.

This design relates to the general configuration or form of a toy savings-bank; and it consist of a frame or casing and the representation of a miniature stage showing the figures of a Punch and Judy show.

Our novel design is clearly represented in the accompanying drawing, in which A represents the frame or casing, having the form of a portable stage provided with a recess, *a*, which is ornamented with curtains B. In the

recess *a* are arranged two figures, C and D, one representing Punch and the other Judy. Between the two figures, in the rear wall of the recess *a*, is an opening, *d*.

We claim—

The design for a toy savings-bank, consisting of a frame or case and the representation of a miniature stage showing the figures of Punch and Judy thereon, substantially as herein shown and described.
