

DESIGN FOR A TOY SAVINGS-BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,120, dated June 2, 1885.

Application filed December 18, 1884. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD L. MORRIS, a citizen of the United States, residing at Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Toy Savings-Bank, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

My design is intended to represent an "old

cabin" or "shanty," roughly put together, the picturesque effect being heightened by the addition of various articles upon its sides, also by providing a life-like figure in the

15 doorway.

In the drawings, Figures 1 and 2 show dif-

ferent views of the same toy.

The roof is flat and has a raised portion or scuttle. The windows are intended to appear

more or less dilapidated, one of them having 20 a stove-pipe hole. Upon the sides of the cabin are hung the skin of an animal, a gridiron, and a banjo. In the doorway stands a figure or statue representing a negro.

I claim—

1. The design for a toy savings-bank, consisting of the old cabin, with its dilapidated walls, roof, and ornamentation upon the walls, substantially as shown and described.

2. The design for a toy savings-bank, consisting of the old cabin, with its dilapidated walls, roof, ornamentation upon the walls, and its figure or statue, substantially as shown and described.
