

DESIGN FOR A TOY SAVINGS-BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,121, dated June 2, 1885.

Application filed January 15, 1885. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JULIUS MUELLER, a citizen of the United States, residing at Wilmington, in the county of New Hanover and 5 State of North Carolina, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Toy Savings-Banks, of which the following is a specification.

This design relates to the general configura-10 tion or form of a toy savings-bank; and it cousists of a base or support, upon which is placed

the figure of a horse.

My new design is clearly represented in the accompanying drawing, in which A represents 15 the base or support, consisting of an oblong chest or case provided with ornaments on its sides. Brepresents the figure of a horse stand-

ing on the base A. C represents a trough resting on the base A in front of the horse. The body of the horse is supported by an or- 20 namental column, D.

I claim-

The design for a toy savings-bank, consisting of a base, A, having the manger or feed-trough C at one end, the central column, D, 25 and the figure of a horse, B, resting on the same, substantially as shown and described.
