

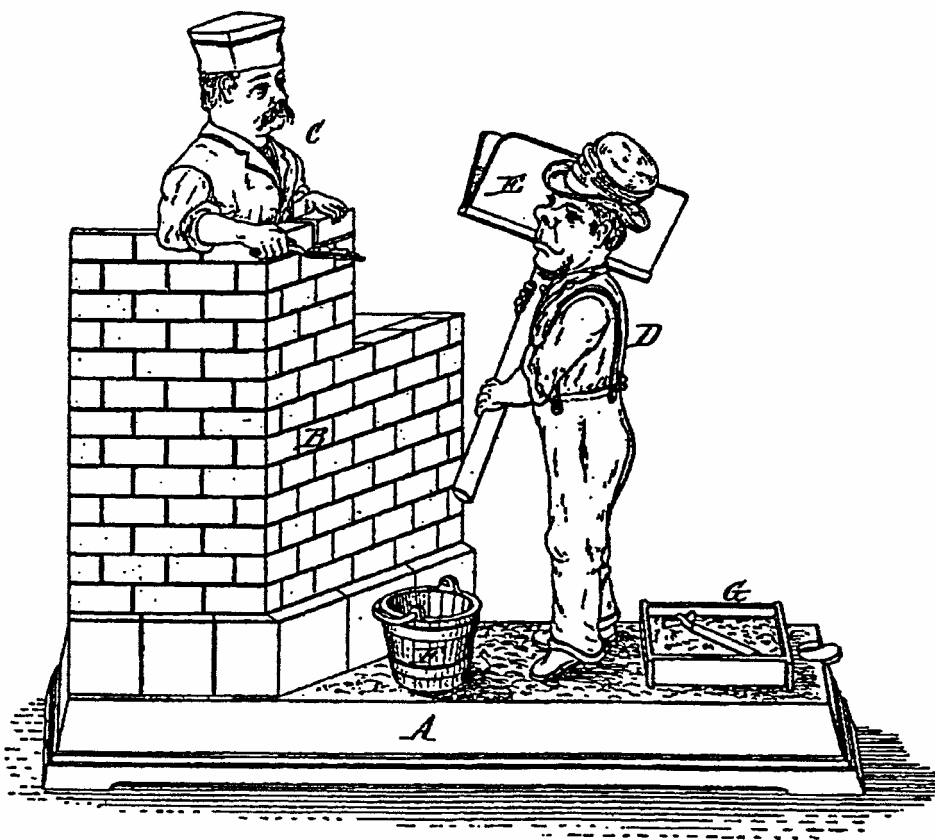

DESIGN FOR A TOY SAVINGS-BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 17,103, dated February 8, 1887.

Application filed January 3, 1887. Serial No. 223,336. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, CHARLES G. SHEPARD
and PETER ADAMS, of the city of Buffalo, in
the county of Erie and State of New York,
5 have invented and produced a new and origi-
nal Design for Toy Savings-Banks, of which
the following is a specification.

This design relates to the general configura-
tion of an ornamental toy savings-bank, which
10 is clearly represented in the accompanying
drawing, making part of this specification.

A represents the elongated base of the sav-
ings-bank, provided at one end with a raised
15 portion, B, representing a brick wall or por-
tion of an unfinished building.

C represents the figure of a man standing be-
hind the wall and holding in his right hand a
trowel and in his left hand a brick.

D represents the figure of a man standing on
the base A, facing the wall B, and carrying on 20
his shoulder a hod, E.

F represents a pail, and G a mortar-recep-
tacle resting on the base A.

We claim as our invention—

The design for a toy savings-bank, consist- 25
ing of a wall, B, the figure of a man standing
behind said wall, and the figure of a man stand-
ing in front of said wall, substantially as shown
and described.
