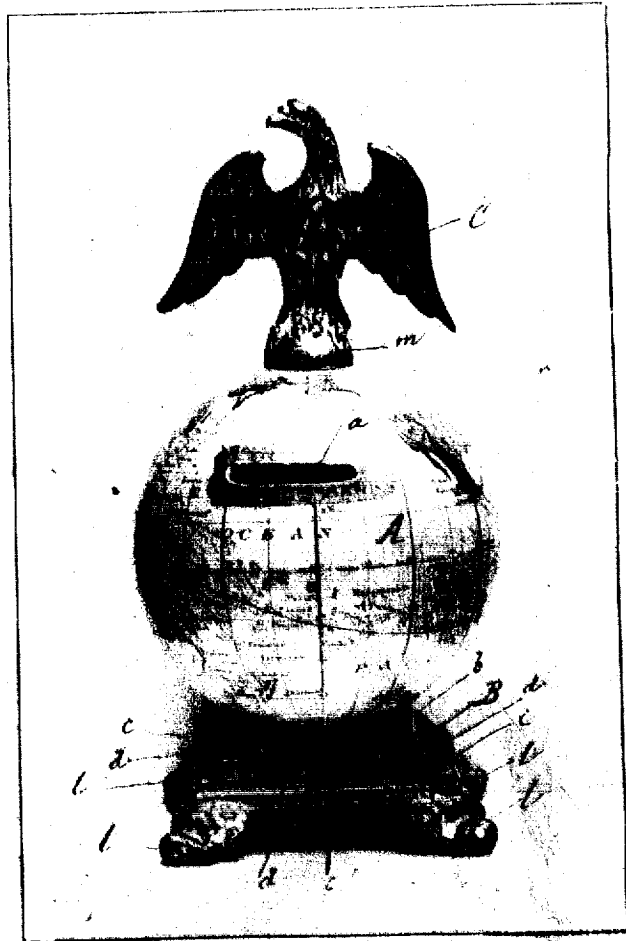

DESIGN FOR A TOY MONEY-SAFE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 19,140, dated June 4, 1889.

Application filed May 1, 1889. Serial No. 309,291. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HERMANN SCHEDLER, a citizen of the United States, residing at Jersey City, in the county of Hudson and State of New Jersey, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Toy Money-Safe, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing.

This design has for its object to provide a novel toy money-safe, as hereinafter described, and shown in the accompanying photograph, which is a perspective view illustrating the design.

The letter A indicates the terrestrial globe, having the opening *a*, and provided at the top with a hemispherical protuberance *m*, surmounted by the representation of a bird C,

with the wings spread. The globe rests on a rectilinear base B, comprising four sides *c*, containing arabesques *d*, and from the base extend legs *l*, each representing the head of a turtle.

What I claim is—

The design for a toy money-safe, consisting of the rectilinear base B, having the turtle-head-shaped legs *l*, the terrestrial globe A, the protuberance *m*, and the bird C, substantially as shown and described.
