DESIGN FOR A TOY SAVINGS-BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 19,356, dated October 15, 1889.

Application filed August 12, 1889. Serial No. 320,506. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, CHARLES G. SHEPARD and PETER ADAMS, citizens of the United States, residing at Buffalo, in the county of Erie and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Toy Savings-Banks, of which the following is a specification.

This design relates to the general configuration or form of an ornamental toy savingsbank; and it consists of the representation of a miniature chimney and a figure representing "Santa Claus" standing near said

chimney.

5 Our novel design is clearly represented in the accompanying drawing, forming part of this specification.

A represents the chimney, forming the body of the bank and having an opening a 20 in its top.

B represents a figure representing Santa Claus standing upon a base C near said chimney and having one hand raised above the top of the chimney.

D represents a basket or bundle of toys 25 strapped upon the back of the figure.

We claim as our invention-

The design for a toy savings-bank herein shown and described, the same comprising a base, a chimney, and a figure representing 30 Santa Claus standing near said chimney, substantially as set forth.
