

DESIGN FOR A TOY MONEY-SAFE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 22,291, dated March 14, 1893.

Application filed January 11, 1892. Serial No. 417,758. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MILTON J. SHIMER, a citizen of the United States of America, residing at Freemansburg, in the county of Northampton and State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Toy Money-Safes, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof.

Figure 1, is a side view in elevation of a toymoney safe showing my design; and Fig. 2, is an end elevation of the same, which views are deemed necessary and sufficient to illustrate my design.

The leading features of my design consist in a miniature representation of a car, the side and end elevations of which are produced with openings representing window frames and having ventilating apertures above the rectangular framework or, open window-work, and air-ports or openings below and along the base of the body of the car.

Referring to the drawings, A is the openwork of the side of the money-safe which is rectangular in general contour representing a line of windows, and having above under the eaves of the roof a line of rectangular open-

ings a; and below the main line of open-work is a line of apertures b, circular in conformation, all as shown in the drawings. The roof c, is oblong and convex-concavo having its edgesoverhanging the sides, and ends rounded and projecting over the platforms d. Centrally on the roof is a longitudinally disposed finial d^{\times} , having central and end ornamentations, as shown. The ends of the safe in elevation have open-work representing two side windows with a door of the same work between them as shown in the drawings. In the end of the car under the projecting roof, is an elongated slot a^{\times} . The base c^{\times} , of the carbody in cross-section is made narrower than the upper portion, as shown in Fig. 2 of the drawings.

Having thus described my design, what I claim is—

The design for a toy money-safe herein described and substantially as shown.
