



DORAS A. STILES, OF MIDDLETOWN, CONNECTICUT.

DESIGN FOR A TOY-BANK.

Specification forming part of Design No. 5,962, dated June 25, 1872.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DORAS A. STILES, of Middletown, in the county of Middlesex and State of Connecticut, have invented a new Design for Toy-Bank; and I do hereby declare the following, when taken in connection with the accompanying drawing and the letters of reference marked thereon, to be a full, clear, and exact description of the same, and which said drawing constitutes part of this specification, and represents in—

Figure 1 a front view, and in Fig. 2 a side view.

This invention relates to a design for toy money-box—that is, a box constructed to receive money through an opening at some point, with the intent that the money cannot be removed through the same opening; and the design consists in the form of the box as shown in the accompanying illustration, and as more fully hereinafter described.

The body of the box represents the four walls of a house, the front showing a door and side-lights, the lights designed to be open to expose the interior of the box, the corners representing coins. The sides show a double latticed window, as seen in Fig. 2, which are also made open, and the corners the same as the front. The roof is in the form of a Mansard roof, with dormer windows upon each side and a chimney upon the top.

The body of the house may be provided with a different roof or the roof with a different body; hence I do not confine myself to the combination of the two, but claim as my invention—

The design for toy-bank described and shown, the roof and body, whether separately or together.
